The rich tradition of Mars Hill Church of God in Christ began in 1923 under the leadership of Superintendent McDowell during a mighty move of God that swept through Neshoba County, MS. Given the turbulent social times of the time, it was no surprise that finding a place to house the group of "Sanctified," "Holy Rollers" was difficult, so the first church services were held in a house owned by Douglas Warren on Highway 486. (MS). During this time, Mars Hill faced challenges such as men throwing rocks on the rooftop during bible study, but the mothers of the church remained determined to teach the Word of God.

Our history of diligent pioneers includes Mother Edice Slaughter, Mother Callie Clemons, Mother Howard Johnson, Mother Bernice Wilson, Mother Winnie Hodge, Sister Allean Rush, Mother Estella Houston, Mother Arceola Harris, Mother Pearleava Miller, Mother Carrie Seales, and Mother Sally Marsh. It is through the faithfulness of these holy women of God that Mars Hill was blessed, and the first official church was erected on a pasture owned by Mr. Tom Lowery. Praise the Lord!

The Pastoral Legacy of Mars Hill includes Elder Couledge, Elder Butler, Elder Bates, Elder

McPayton, Elder J.D. Jones, Elder C.H. Sharpe, Superintendent J.E. Eaton (interim), and Superintendent George Murray. The forefathers of Mars Hill laid the foundation and legacy that continues to impact and influence the faithfulness of our members and the community. While much is not known of the daily lives of these men of God, we do know that their efforts were not in vain.

The foremothers of Mars Hill were diligent and willing in the work of the ministry through prayer, bible study, and missions. Their contributions set a standard for women of God in the church and community. Foremothers including Mother Clara Bell

Clemons, Mother Hodge, Mother Callie Clemons, and others worked together in unity, and their harvest helped the church continue to flourish.

In 1969, Mars Hill welcomed its eighth pastor, the young Elder Isaac Harris. As a young father, his heart for the youth overflowed in the ministry and his



mission to save the youth was embraced and the church grew mightily. Members would often leave the services saying, "Oh, what a time did the saints have!". Praise in song and dance would go on for hours with Brother Slaughter playing the guitar and Msn. Harris and the church mothers singing Songs of Zion. During this time of exponential growth, the church grew via word-of-mouth and people would stand outside of the doors and windows to hear the members sing. People from all walks of life would come for the worship experience that for many were new and wonderful, a glorious time in the Lord. Pastor Harris would conduct revivals to help carry out the commission of preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ. The church grounds were saturated with prayer and the

anointing of God could be felt by simply walking on the grounds.

During his second year of pastoral leadership, Pastor Harris was burdened by the physical condition of the church building and committed to not receiving another Pastoral Appreciation program until a new facility was completed. Shortly after this declaration, he led the church in a search for land while encouraging all members that were sharecroppers to purchase their own land and build houses. His wisdom in leadership was not only a blessing to the church but to the daily lives of its members and many became first-time homeowners. Fundraisers were held in preparation for the future: a new church edifice. His instructions were meticulous and missioned, including the directives regarding donations and fundraisers; no fish fries, chicken plates, or cold iced tea fundraisers.

Pastor Harris' leadership and character in the church and community garnered the help of many who gave generously through Church rallies, which were uplifting and encouraging to all who attended. The power of God moved in the hearts of the church members and "the spirit of giving" flowed within the community and throughout the county.

During this time, the brothers of the church agreed to apply for a bank loan as a ready response to their commitment to the vision of building a house for God. With God's favor before them, they successfully secured the loan. Purchasing land and ground-breaking began. The Mars Hill family faced many challenges during the new construction, but through faith and perseverance, they completed the new edifice eight months after the ground-breaking day (1975). The new edifice included two restrooms and a small dining room. Pastor Harris accepted the call to compel men to Christ and increased evangelism through community outreach, producing an influx of church growth among young adults. Members of Mars Hill referred to this as "when the sheep begat sheep". With yet another influx of church growth from within the community; the church now needed to expand the building to accommodate the people.

On August 13, 1993, an additional acre of land was purchased with new additions beginning in September of '95. New additions included the main sanctuary, two front lobby restrooms, and a rectory (pastoral housing). Further renovations and additions in '97 consisted of the dining hall, church exterior (updated to brick), new carpet installation, and several maintenance projects. The people kept

coming and the church continued to grow. Within a short period of time, the church purchased additional land, bringing its land assets to over five (5) acres including the church cemetery. The addition of the church cemetery prompted county contributions (culvert installations) creating easier and more efficient access.



Mother Hodge was recorded as the first person to be buried in the cemetery.

Pastor Harris worked with local officials, businesses, and members of the community in completing other projects/additions including paving the church parking lot (financial contribution of Mother Willie Yarell) and the donation of a piano. New church pews were purchased (donated old pews to another church), and community members discounted construction resources along with numerous financial contributions.


Local hospital workers would often call on the members of Mars Hill to pray for those dealing with health challenges and their testimonies of healing soon spread across the county. As Pastor Harris would often say, "It's not about a shout and a dance, but how you live in the community that makes a difference.".

Under the leadership and administration of Superintendent Isaac Harris, Mars Hill experienced unsurmountable church growth, development, and land acquisitions that continue to serve as a blessing for the church and community.

In January 2006, Mars Hill pastor and members stood in agreement to pay off the church mortgage; this bond of unity in the faith resulted in an early pay-off and substantial savings for the church.

Superintendent

Stanley Harris (2010 - 2016) Superintendent Stanley Harris was appointed as pastor of Mars Hill in 2010, after the passing of his father Superintendent Isaac Harris. He continued his father's legacy by increasing church assets with the purchase and

addition of ten (10) acres of land.

Elder Melvin Roberson (2016 - 2019)

Elder Melvin Roberson became the Pastor in 2016 and continued to grow and develop the church. He accomplished great things spiritually during his pastoral years at Mars Hill. Many souls were delivered, and lives were changed under his leadership. He passed shortly after his third pastoral appreciation.

Elder Stanley Gipson (2020 - 2021)

Elder Stanley Gipson was appointed Pastor in February 2020, one month before the global COVID-19 pandemic. As a result of its global impact federal, state, and city/county guidelines were introduced for large gatherings. Mars Hill along with countless churches across the globe were challenged to take the gospel online. Under

the leadership of Elder Gipson Mars Hill enters the digital era incorporating technology to broadcast all church services/events hosted via conference calls, Zoom, and social media.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and social distancing guidelines, church services were later held outside on the church grounds. Pastor Gipson's sincerity in sharing God's Word could be heard throughout the community encouraging a renewed



commitment to faith. These "parking lot services" were anointed with the power of God and ushered in yet another expansion of the church.

Following the leadership example of our pioneers, Pastor Gipson began church renovations during the winter of 2020 for new flooring and cosmetic updates (walls, trim/ borders) great and you could tell that the grounds were anointed as the messages were delivered. The next big renovation of the church also came while Pastor Stanley Gipson was pastoring in the winter of 2020. Due to a harsh winter storm, a pipe burst in the church dining room area. Pastor Gipson put together a team, and it was decided to redo the church floors, remove the wood paneling, and paint the walls. New trim and borders were installed throughout the church as well. Pastor Gipson was excited to add his "signature piece', a wall mural by Justin Ransburg (2021) depicting a beautiful outdoor scene of a family baptism; the flowers and trees seen in the painting represent the flowers and trees you can see in the fields around the church. Pastor Gipson would often say, "When God looks at us, He sees the beauty in us just like the beauty in. the flowers around us". Pastor Gipson passed in May 2021 shortly after his first year as Pastor.



<u>Elder Porter Ross, Jr</u> (2021 -

Our current pastor, Elder Porter Ross Jr., was appointed in October 2021. With the continuance of the global pandemic, Pastor Ross quickly initiated necessary technology updates and developed strategic ways to continue inperson services in compliance with COVID safety guidelines. Updates included monitors in the fellowship hall and sanctuary for live-streaming services as well as new PCs, cameras, and microphones that were vital in this new era of worship. He

He has plans to use the church van to pick up community youth and bring them to service to minister to them. There are also plans to give back to the community through the "Fill the Fridge" ministry at local schools. He has plans to invest in audio and video equipment in pursuit of media excellence, as our ministry reaches beyond the walls of the church through web and social media. He plans to partner with civic entities to reach and minister to those in need.



updated the church by-laws, church handbook, and completed the set-up of the financial management and reporting system.

Pastor Ross has a vision to claim the harvest of souls that God has ordained. It was prophesied that he would preach to the multitudes, a community without walls. Following the leading of God, Pastor Ross is building a team at Mars Hill to bring the vision into fruition. He has updated the church logo to reflect that vision. He has challenged the church to take the training Pastor Ross was led to create a church magazine, entitled "Legacy" to pay homage to the pioneers, leaders, and members that have and still are contributing to the ministry at Mars Hill.

Mars Hill was established in 1923. This year we are celebrating our centennial (2023). Pastor Ross and the Mars Hill family honor our forefathers and foremothers who have pioneered the way. We celebrate their commitment and sacrifice in laying a solid foundation upon which we can continue to build.

C uperintendent George Murray committed his life to Christ at $\mathbf J$ an early age, and accepted his call to the gospel ministry in the late 1950's. He was appointed Pastor of Mars Hill Church of God in Christ in the late 1950's. He loved the church with all of his heart and served the church with distinction. Over a period of years, Superintendent Murray prayerfully pastored the following churches: Walnut Grove Church of God in Christ, Anderson Temple Church of God in Christ, Murray Chapel Church of God in Christ, and St. John Church of God in Christ. He was a spiritual and dependable leader who loved serving to the best of his ability. He worked untiringly; drawing, leading, and guiding mankind to the fold of Christ; encouraging them to live together in love and unity. Superintendent Murray was destined to be a builder; as evidenced in the lives that he spiritually nurtured, and the edifices that he expertly built. Each of his duties and responsibilities as a contractor of dwellings was executed with precise skill and deep concern. Growing up in a family of nine children, he developed a strong spirit of independence in thought and deed. Economic independence combined with strong Christian values, enabled him to persevere in most situations. Defiance of cowardice and laziness became a hallmark for Superintendent Murray and for men and women following his path. He was a guiding light and a beacon for all to follow.

Superintendent Murray reflected the following words of wisdom:

1969-2010

Superintendent Isaac Harris was saved, sanctified, and filled with the Holy Ghost at the age of fourteen and was anointed and called to preach at fifteen. Superintendent was ordained as an Elder in 1967 under the Late Jurisdictional Prelate Bishop Theodore Davis. In 1969, at the age of 28, he was appointed as Pastor of the Mars Hill COGIC in Philadelphia, MS.

Elder Isaac Harris was a man of vision and progression and desired to see everyone living prosperous lives; naturally and spiritually. He would often quote: "You must live a balanced life- first natural and then spiritual." When seeing the condition of the church and the lifestyle of the members, God's people, Pastor Harris became disturbed. Mars Hill was dilapidated and located on the property of Caucasian landowners in a pasture. Moreover, many of the members lived on property owned by Caucasian landowners and were Sharecroppers.

Pastor Harris made a conscious decision to make a difference in the community. After two years of receiving Pastoral Appreciations, Elder Harris spoke by faith and declared that he would not accept another Appreciation until a new House of Worship was built. He prophetically spoke and said, "We're going to purchase land and build God a House, and I want all of you to become homeowners and taxpayers!". In 1971, the land was acquired off Highway 486, now Road 737. In 1973, the new concrete-blocked building, Mars Hill Church of God in Christ was erected with two bathrooms and a small dining area. Not only did God bless the saints to build a new church edifice with enough land for a cemetery and future expansions, but the members also purchased land and built houses in the community. The Mars Hill Church Family grew, and souls were added to the kingdom as God gave the increase. During Pastor Harris's tenure, there were several renovation projects, but the next major renovation took place in 1998.

Renovations included the bricking of the church, upgrading the sanctuary, addition of the Pastor's Office and Bedroom, the addition of a Finance Office with computers and modern technology, and a new dining area and kitchen. He also purchased the Mars Hill COGIC sign, which is currently standing. Pastor Harris and the members paid off the church's mortgage in 2006, one year earlier than agreed.

Pastor Harris was always attending conventions, reading, and studying to ensure that he offered the people the best available information and opportunities for growth and development. He would say, "If you don't go, you won't grow." He was also a strong advocate for education. He made certain that the adult members, especially officers, were provided training to better operate in their positions or ministries. He also encouraged all school-aged members to attend college and acquire higher degrees. He was the first example of this by sending all six of his children to college. Moreover, he would give financially to

encourage and support the church's college students.

Pastor Harris was a visionary and was constantly developing initiatives to build the family, church, and community. During his tenure as Pastor he upgraded the Finance Department to comply with the IRS status for churches. The church attained a 501C3 tax status with a tax ID number. He also changed the three-member Board of Trustees to a Board of five members. Pastor Harris implemented several other projects, including organizing a Food and Clothing Pantry Ministry, organizing an outreach bus ministry, updating the organizational structure of the church's auxiliaries, developing a church handbook with bylaws and procedures, implementing a "New Members" Orientation Class, and organizing a Vacation Bible School. To list all initiatives and accomplishments Pastor Harris implemented during his forty-year (40) tenure would be impossible. However, the most important details of his life and pastorate are that he was an anointed man of God who exhibited honesty and integrity

at home, in his community, and at church. He could relate to people of all races, ages, and backgrounds, in and outside the church. Many were miraculously healed, delivered, and set free. Elder Isaac Harris believed in holy living! He would say, "If you don't church, you're going to devil." Pastor Harris served in many capacities in the church - District Superintendent, Jurisdictional and Regional Chairman of the Pastors and Elders Council, and Administrative Assistant to Bishop Hollis Musgroveto name a few. He also pastored, built, and upgraded churches during his years in ministry, including the Center Hill Church of God in Christ in Louisville, MS, which he also pastored until his demise. However, with all of his extra responsibilities, he never neglected his pastoral duties at Mars Hill. Pastor Harris was a firm but compassionate and understanding leader.

Because of the far-reaching vision and innovativeness of Superintendent Harris, the church grew. Superintendent Isaac Harris was indeed one of God's Anointed ones, a didactical and dynamic preacher. He was known for his

booming voice, convicting messages and prayers, and God-inspired songs often composed after preaching a life-changing sermon. He gave more of himself than most people could ever dream. He was a great man of humility, a true believer of true holiness, a Preacher of righteousness, a Servant Leader unto the end. In 2003, Superintendent Harris experienced several strokes, leaving him physically handicapped. Throughout the years of his affliction, he continued to serve with the approval of Bishop Hollis Musgrove. He maintained order, respect, and accountability even during his times of illness. Bishop Musgrove stated, "Superintendent Harris does more in supporting the Jurisdiction, with his affliction than those who are well." Superintendent Isaac Harris was a family man who loved and was married for over fifty (50) years to his wife, Missionary Rosie Harris. He, his wife, and six (6) children worked diligently in ministry together, serving God's people in whatever areas needed. Superintendent Isaac Harris worked faithfully until death. He transitioned this life on August 15, 2010, leaving a rich legacy behind.

C uperintendent Stanley Harris was born on October 8, 1964, in Louisville, Mississippi, to the late Superintendent Isaac and District Missionary Rosie Mitchell Harris. He is the only son in a family of six. He grew up in the Pleasant Grove Community, and was a member of the Mt. Olive Church of God in Christ under the late Elder G.W. Harris. He later joined the Mars Hill Church of God in Christ, in Philadelphia, Mississippi to work in the ministry with his father. Pastor Harris participated in YPWW, Sunday School and other church activities. He was a choir director, song leader, praise leader, and a musician. His instrument of choice was the trombone.

Superintendent Stanley Harris graduated with honors from Louisville High School in 1982. He attended and graduated (1986) Summa Cum Laude from Alcorn State University in Lorman, Mississippi with a degree in Economics. He continued graduate studies at Princeton University, University of Florida's Graduate School of Business, and Jackson State University's Public Policy Program. He moved to Atlanta, Georgia in 1986. He joined the New Life Church of God in Christ under the leadership of Bishop Joseph Hogan. Being a minister of the Gospel, he worked diligently in the ministry, serving faithfully in many capacities.

Superintendent Harris moved back to Mississippi in 1996 and continued to work in the ministry. Under the leadership of Bishop Hollis Musgrove, he served as Jurisdictional AIM Secretary for 13 years, Coordinator for Pastors and Elders Conference for 12 years, and Assistant within the Jurisdictional Financial Secretary's office for 10 years. He became an ordained Elder in 2004, and was appointed Pastor of Mars Hill Church of God in Christ in 2010. Later he was appointed as Superintendent of District Twelve in 2015. He was employed with the State of Mississippi Division of Medicaid in 1997 where he remained until his death.

Superintendent Stanley Harris worked faithfully with his father, the late Superintendent Isaac Harris. He was a man with a vision. As Pastor of the Mars Hill Church of God in Christ, he implemented "Vision 2011 and Beyond: Building on a Sure Foundation".

During his tenure he accomplished the following:

- Acquired property at Hwy 486 and Road 737, and additional adjacent property.
- Purchased recording (DVD/CD) devices for recording services, and prepared appropriate place for these devices.
- Cleared property of under growth and some trees to allow view of the church from Hwy 486.

Cister Rosie Harris served with her husband, Superintendent Isaac Harris, at Mars Hill Church of God in Christ from 1969-2010. Sister Harris was twentyfive (25) years old when Pastor Harris was appointed to Mars Hill. Although she was young, she had been saved, sanctified, and filled with the Holy Ghost since age 11 and was no stranger to working in the ministry. She learned early in life how to share her husband with the people of God and maintain a healthy and balanced relationship. Moreover, she and her six children – Mavis, Jeanette, Rheta, Stanley, Geraldine, and Calandra – became a part of Pastor Harris' ministry team and worked untiringly by his side as he ministered to God's people.

Missionary Harris recounts her first encounter at Mars Hill as being filled with much love and enthusiasm. Upon arrival, two women graciously met her and Pastor Harris at their car. They introduced themselves as Mother Clara Bell Clemons and Mother Howard Lee Johnson. They later learned about the other church mothers, who at that time included Mother Edice Slaughter, Mother Winnie Hodge, Mother Callie Clemons, and Mother Bernice Wilson. However, Mother Edice Slaughter was very ill and passed away immediately after Pastor Harris was assigned to the church. Missionary Harris was attracted to the older Mothers of the church and depended on them for wisdom, guidance, and covering as she matured as mother, wife, and First Lady.

Missionary Harris served Mars Hill in many capacities and was instrumental in birthing and organizing several organizations and events. She served as the church musician and service leader during Pastor Harris' initial years of service. She could be seen and heard singing and playing the piano on any given Sunday! She also organized the youth department, where extensive training on the "History of the Church of God in Christ," "The Old and New Testament," and "Doctrine, Policies, and Procedures of the Church of God in Christ" were offered. Sister Elden Clemons worked faithfully with her and served as the Local YPWW President. Mother Clara Bell Clemons and Deacon Calvin Wilson served as the Counselors for the youth department. Meetings were scheduled monthly, and it sparked a love for God and the church in the hearts of the young and old alike. Over two (2) generations of youth were trained and acquired the



knowledge needed to be productive, prosperous citizens and lovers of God. Sister Harris and Sister Elden Clemons even made provisions with help and support from the church to carry youth representatives to the Annual State YPWW Congress in Jackson, MS.

As Servant of the Church, she helped organize the Women's Department. Under her leadership was birthed the Annual Young Women's Christian Council Retreat, (YWCC) held annually at Lake Tiak O'Khata, in Louisville, MS. This retreat provided relaxation, training, and empowerment to the women from across the United States. It grew tremendously and exceeded all expectations. Many souls were blessed, encouraged, and restored. Guest came from near and far to experience the power of God in a setting that was inviting and free.

Pastor Harris established the Center and Mars Hill Ministries Food and Clothing Pantry Ministry. Missionary Harris was given the task to serve as CEO of the Ministry and was responsible for the complete operational set-up. Training was provided through Mississippi Food Network of Jackson, MS. Many people were blessed through this ministry with food and clothing throughout the communities of Winston and Neshoba Counties. Missionary Harris was also the visionary of the "Total Woman Women's Conference," held annually each year to provide information, training, and empowerment sessions for the women of God. Sessions about mental health, abuse, financial planning, and many others were explored and discussed. Spiritual impartation and healing were experienced. The Lord's blessings and approval were greatly manifested, and the Conference flourished with sessions that empowered women naturally as well as spiritually.

Lady Harris also established a three days and nights Shut-in at the beginning of each year at both churches pastored by her husband. Souls were saved, restored, and filled with the Holy Ghost during the shut-ins.

While serving as Pastor's Wife at Mars Hill, she was elevated to many other positions—District and Jurisdictional to include:

The last seven years of ministry was very challenging, after Pastor Harris suffered several strokes, but God sustained the family and the church. Missionary Harris was a pillar of strength and consistency. She continued working in the ministry and offering God elevated praises during the many crises that were going on in her personal life. BROTHER JEREMY'S "VICTORY OVER HODGKINS LYMPHOMA"

Jeremy was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma in October 2003. Before the diagnosis a large mass was discovered in his chest

during a CT scan. Jeremy

was immediately sent

and admitted to Blair

E. Batson Hospital. A

biopsy was scheduled

to determine the type

of cancer. It was during

the biopsy that Jeremy

coded. According to the

doctors, Jeremy had a 50/50

chance of survival. Jeremy was

placed on a ventilator and admitted

to ICU. The saints began to pray and intercede on Jeremy's behalf. A few

days later, Jermy's team of doctors

informed his family that the diagnosis was Hodgkin's Lymphoma. A regimen

of chemotherapy was started. After a few treatments, the mass began to

shrink. After about a month in ICU Jeremy was moved to a room on the pediatric cancer floor. After a few days, Jeremy coded again. The team

of doctors then decided that he needed a tracheostomy and a breathing tube. After these procedures, Jeremy remained in the hospital and received rehabilitation services. After being in the hospital for about 2 ½ months, Jeremy's mother told

the doctors that she was ready to take her baby home. The doctors began making the preparations for Jeremy to be released from the hospital. On the day that Jeremy was to be released, the doctors informed his parents that the cancer had returned. Jeremy needed to undergo radiation and chemotherapy treatments. It was decided by the

doctors and his parents that he needed to remain in the hospital while undergoing these treatments. Jeremy was released from the hospital in January 2004, after a three month stay. He left the hospital still not able to walk, talk, eat or care for himself. At home he continued to receive speech, physical and occupational therapy. Jeremy eventually was admitted to Methodist Rehabilitation Center for inpatient rehab. Jeremy's mobility continued to improve and he began using a device to help him communicate. During his stay at Methodist, Jeremy's speech began to return. His first word was "Mama". After about a month he was released from Methodist Rehabilitation Center and began outpatient therapy. After intense therapy and many prayers Jeremy learned to walk, talk, and care for himself! A few months later, his mom noticed a lymph node on his neck. The doctors performed a biopsy and

it was discovered that the cancer had returned once again. The team of doctors discussed Jeremy's case and decided that the best treatment plan was to undergo a stem cell transplant. Once again Jeremy had to endure both chemotherapy



and radiation treatments. After these treatments, the cancer was in remission and Jeremy's stem cells were harvested for the treatment plan. The stem

cell transplant was performed in 2005. Jeremy has been cancer free since this treatment. Jeremiah 32:27 states: Behold, I am the Lord, the God of all flesh: is there anything too hard for me? Jeremy is living proof that there is nothing too hard for God. God is a healer!

MOTHER ELDEN CLEMONS "VICTORY OVER CANCER"

B efore I received the diagnosis of cancer, the Lord put me in His Word in a way I can't explain! I would read and study God's Word over and over again. Sometimes, I would go by and just lay my hand on the bible. I knew that something in my life was about to change, but I didn't know what God was preparing me for.

One day, I asked God, "What are you telling me? What is it you want me to

do?" What are you preparing me for?" I asked Him this, but I didn't know that just a few days later on December 27, 2018,

> I would be diagnosed with breast cancer. It was then that I knew what the preparation was for. It was for me to go through trusting Him, standing on faith, and believing in Him.

The first thing I thought about was " How am I going to tell my husband and children?" I thought for sure I was going to die. I remember Elder

Stanley Harris giving a testimony and it was for me in my time of going through. I remember how God worked for him and I began to tell God, "If you did it for Elder Stanley Harris, You can do it for me." By faith I realized what God had already done for me. He was with me back then, and He would be with me now.

There were times that I thought I couldn't go through all the tests the doctors had me doing. Some were uncomfortable but God allowed me to go through. It

seemed like test after test, but Jesus would calm all my fears. In a quiet still voice, Jesus would let me know He was with me. He gave me strength and increased my faith. I continued to study the Word, fasted, and prayed daily. I stayed in the Word. I trusted God and He placed these

scriptures in my heart: Jeremiah 29:13, Isaiah 53:5, Mark 11:24. I would read those scriptures daily and my faith, trust, and confidence in Christ grew stronger and stronger. I remembered His Word when He said, He would not leave me or forsake me. He would not put more on me than I could bear. Realizing that there is nothing too hard for God, I remembered that He is a Savior. Instead of worrying about what I had, I began to thank God for my life.

When I went in to do my biopsy, I thanked God for letting me go in and come out. God put a thankfulness praise in my heart. He took away the fear and replaced it with a "Thank You" praise. He blessed me through the surgery. When I went in to surgery, there was no fear. My children were extremely supportive and they stayed with me all the way until it was over. That was a big help and very encouraging to me. My daughter especially was an encouragement to me. The Lord blessed me to come home, and I can't tell you how he blessed me. Things I didn't have to go through were even surprising to the Home Health Care nurses. I knew it was nobody but God

that had blessed me in the way He did.

When I went back for my check up, my doctor told me I would not have to have chemotherapy nor radiation! I had a "Thank You, JESUS" praise ceremony right there in the office with my daughter. A "Thank

You, JESUS" just continued to flow in and through me. I know how good God is and how He can work things out. If we have faith, trust, and praise Him while we are going through, we can see Him working in miraculous ways. It is nothing I did, because all the praise, honor, and glory belongs to God. When you hear me "Thanking Jesus", you just don't know it is something I can't explain! I thank God for my healing. I give Him all the praise and glory. All of it belongs to Jesus Christ, My Savior!

would like to thank God for all that He has done and for Him keeping me through all these years! He deserves all the praise, honor, and glory! He is a keeper!

When I moved back to Philadelphia, MS, in 2017 I had two goals in mind. The first was to pay my tithes, and the second was to attend services at the church. Little did I know that God had a third plan for me, and that was, to beat cancer! As I think back, my parents had 8 children (four boys and four girls). Six out of the eight of us have been diagnosed with cancer. All four of my parents daughters and one son was diagnosed with breast cancer. One of my brothers was diagnosed with prostate cancer but has been a survivor for over 35 years. That means, five out of the eight were diagnosed with breast cancer and one with prostate cancer. That may seem overwhelming to others, but to God be the glory! Several of my siblings have died from cancer but I am so thankful that God is still keeping me.

In 2017, I felt a lump in my breast and could tell it was growing. I knew immediately it was cancer. I knew I would need a mammogram, but I thought about my older sister and my baby sister that had already died from breast cancer a couple of years earlier. Nevertheless, God was still in control. In June of 2017, I had a mammogram and a biopsy performed. I remembered Mother Elden Clemons giving her testimony, and it was an encouragement and help to me. She would always answer my questions

and I could count on her to laugh with me. Cancer can be very devastating but I never had a fear of dying. I remember talking to God and He truly sent me what I needed, "A mother and a friend".

One of the older mothers, who was about 90 years old, came from my previous church. Her name was Mother Carter, and she came to town with her two daughters to see me. One of the most amazing things she did was just hold me and rock me. She had no idea of how God used her to bless me. One of the things I said I needed in my prayers was, "God, I need a mother". Yes, God saw my need and He provided just that. I began to walk and pray. My talks with God were amazing. He never allowed fear to set in or allowed me to worry. I can truly say it was well with my soul. One of Mother Carter's daughters would walk with me and she just allowed me to talk. She didn't say much. She just allowed me to talk, and she listened.

In July 2017, I received a shot, and when the surgeons took me to the operating room I began to think about the cross. The table in the operating room while I was laying on it reminded me of the cross. I was laying on it with my arms stretched out on each side and it reminded me of what Jesus had already done. Oh, what

Jesus did on the cross for us! What an amazing thing did He did on the cross for us. When I think back, I realized I never experience any pain and never got sick during the operation. The cancer was removed. It was gone, and I went home and could do things for myself. I am so grateful. One of the deacons and his wife, Deacon Freddie and Patricia Wilson came and fixed meals for me seven days. I am so thankful for that.

About two months later, I started having a few sick spells and some of them happened at church. Without hesitation,

God again answered my prayers because even when I couldn't speak and say something was wrong, He sent someone to check on me and provided every need. Even something as small as Mother Hattie Horne giving me a piece of candy, while I was experiencing nausea and couldn't move, was a great act of kindness. God

answered my prayers in those moments. Even though, I experience sick spells while taking the medications, I am so grateful to God that I never had to take Chemo.

Mother Elden Clemons gave me an assignment and her testimony and encouraging words helped me in more ways than I can say. I remember standing on God's Word. I stood on His promises. I began to say, "By His stripes, I am HEALED! I am HEALED! I shall live and not die! Yes, He is a keeper. He has kept and is keeping me! Lord I thank you for being a keeper!"



In July 2022, it was four years that I celebrated being a breast cancer survivor. I tell you, He will keep you! I have been blessed to see 80 years old and I am so thankful to God. I thank Him for His grace and His mercy. I thank Him for all His blessings and for a discerning spirit. When I was a branch manager at the credit union many years ago, there was an older women about 75 years old that said, "Parker, Come here". She told me I was smiling everyday, dressed nice, and acted as if everything was ok but she knew I was hurting. She was right. During those days I had many things that

I was going through and was praying constantly for my children. Now, I can see that's one of the gifts that God has given me while at Mars Hill. When I first came, I could see that there were so many hurting young women, but He is using me to pray and to help encourage those young ladies now. I know He has me at Mars Hill for a reason. I was a First Lady of a church up north for

over 35 years, and God is allowing me to use my gifts received while there to now help others. "I thank you, God! My soul says, Yes. My heart says, Yes. My will says, Yes". As Revelations 12:11 reminds me, "I have overcame the enemy by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of my testimony".

The care, support, love, compassion, kindness, laughter and knowledge I encountered by God and Mars Hill members and leaders is beyond belief and has been life-giving." This is my TESTIMONY!




